Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was posted on the State electronic calendar as required by HRS section 92-7(b).

A short video was played to explain procedures for this virtual meeting and how members of the public can participate and interact with the Board during the meeting.

Chairperson Isemoto proceeded with roll call. All Board members were present, except Mr. Nishek, who is excused.

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, Chairperson Isemoto called the meeting to order at 9:09 a.m.

Minutes: It was moved by Mr. Higashihara, seconded by Mr. Leong (with the exception of Mr. O'Donnell, who lost connection to the meeting), and carried by the majority to approve the Applications Committee Meeting Minutes of July 6, 2021 and the Board Meeting and Executive Session Meeting Minutes of June 25, 2021, as circulated.

Bob Takamatsu, attorney and Leif Sjostrand, Senior Estimator, Goodfellow Bros. LLC ("Goodfellow") stated that they were present to discuss the scope inquiry on the Board's agenda.

Executive Officer Ito stated that the scope inquiry will be taken in the order stated on the agenda.

Consumer  
Education  
Outreach:

Regulated Industries Complaints Office – Consumer Education Outreach  
Esther Brown, Complaints and Enforcement Officer

Ms. Esther Brown, Complaints and Enforcement Officer of the Regulated Industries Complaints Office ("RICO") and Jayson Horiuchi, DCCA Communications Officer, were present.

Ms. Brown stated that she has been the Complaints and Enforcement Officer for two years. Prior to that she was a RICO staff attorney for many years. She is present to discuss the concept of consumer education. In the last couple of months there have been stories of consumers who have been hiring unlicensed contractors or contractors who have worked out of scope and basically have left the consumers out to dry.

Ms. Brown has been communicating with organizations that have seniors as their constituents in which she has provided letters and information that RICO publishes. She stated that it is difficult and challenging as RICO itself is reactionary and based on complaints coming in.

RICO has an existing education campaign for consumers to empower and warn them about unlicensed activity and also, in particular, unlicensed contracting. That consists of going out into the community to BIA home shows, civic gatherings, and senior fairs both on Oahu and the neighbor islands. She stated that the consumers do not know who RICO is or they are not interested. At shows, RICO offers items such as candy (i.e. swag) and once the consumer came to the RICO booth, they take the time to read their information, ask questions, and are extremely grateful.

At a senior fair in early 2019 on the island of Kauai, one of RICO's investigators was amazed that there were a lot of people that came to the event and didn't know about RICO. She approached consumers and brought them to the table, and they were so grateful that there was an organization that was out there to help them make wise choices and not be left holding the bag.

RICO is very good at written material (i.e. brochures) that are passed out at fairs. These brochures can be downloaded directly from RICO's website. RICO is also good when there are gatherings and they can go out in the public. RICO is not good at getting the word out in other ways or forms. Part of the reason is because it is expensive. A lot of people may not know of RICO's website or the wealth of material available or may not have access to the internet or are not familiar with RICO, so the consumer is not aware that there is a lot of material available that can help them make better decisions as a consumer.

Ms. Brown is here to present an idea that is still in the concept phase. People in the community are vulnerable populations, ordinary members of the public who still read print medium (e.g. Star-Advertiser, Midweek, outer island local newspapers). She suggested that RICO target consumers by putting an ad in the print mediums as well as areas where people go to look for personal services such as Craigslist. These ads would warn consumers to beware of unlicensed contractors.

Another concept is to brand unlicensed contracting by coming up with a logo, ad or symbol that RICO can get out into the community that can cause consumers to pause before making a decision.

RICO is working on coming up with ideas and researching a cost estimate. She asked the Board to partner up with RICO and fund the project with the Contractors Education Fund.

Executive Officer Ito stated that the Board was working with the previous communications officer exploring multi-media, and after he left DCCA it was passed on to Mr. Horiuchi. She went on to say that the previous communication officer's endeavor was much larger; however, the subject of unlicensed contractors could be worked on at this time.

Executive Officer Ito noted that DCCA ran public service announcement commercials about unlicensed persons in general and inquired whether that decreased the number of unlicensed complaints. Ms. Brown stated that she did not have the statistics but knows that the commercials had a positive impact.

RICO will work with Mr. Horiuchi and keep the Board apprised as their plan develops.

  - a. Goodfellow Bros. LLC

Requests the following determinations with regard to the County of Maui Emergency Slope Repair Haiku Road Near Hog Back Road, Job No. 21-52:

- (i) Is Rousseau Services permitted to perform rockfall mitigation work, including the installation of soil nails in conjunction with shotcrete, under its C-68 RL Rockfall mitigation contractor's license?
- (ii) Is slope stabilization work treated the same as rockfall mitigation work?

Leif Sjostrand, Senior Estimator, Goodfellow Bros. LLC ("Goodfellow"), Robert Takamatsu, General Counsel for Goodfellow, Pierre Rousseau, RME, Rousseau Services LLC and Ed Brown, PRME and Director of Operations for Goodfellow were present. Mr. Takamatsu stated that Goodfellow was the low bidder for the County of Maui project entitled Emergency Slope Repair Haiku Road Near Hog Back Road ("Project") and are present to seek clarification as to work that can be performed by the C-68RL Rockfall mitigation contractor.

Members reviewed and discussed the information provided by Goodfellow.

Mr. Sjostrand stated that he thought that this project clearly required a C-68RL licensee. He went on to say that the project involved the same design of soil nails by the same engineers as other projects and has been applied throughout east Maui. This project has 268 soil nails totaling 7,890 linear feet holding up the cliff above the road.

Mr. Rousseau stated that he has 30 years of experience and has been performing this type of work for the past 15 years on Maui and the Big Island. He

stated that he is currently performing the Hana Highway project that used the same nails, the same engineering, and the same engineers. This project involves soil nails and gunite. This is the first time he has been rejected for this type of project.

Chairperson Isemoto stated that when the C-68RL classification was first established it referenced wire netting. He noted that there was a prior scope determination that shotcrete may be done as incidental and supplemental to the C-68RL. This project is clearly shotcrete and soil nails. The C-68RL classification did not specifically include shotcrete work and the soil nails were part of the rockfall protection systems. He went on to say that this project is strictly shotcrete application and there is no netting whatsoever. The C-68RL classification was based on rockfall mitigation using netting type of systems. Rockfall mitigation using wire netting was not covered by the C-34 Soil stabilization and the C-23 Gunite classifications. The C-68RL classification was created to specifically address rockfall mitigation using netting and it does not appear that it was intended to purely apply shotcrete.

Mr. Leong asked if there are any rocks that must be stabilized or removed from the slope. Mr. Sjostrand stated that the soil condition at the Project is rock that has completely lost its structure (degraded rock). The soil nails will definitely get into rock, it is slope stabilization to keep the side from falling down. Mr. Leong stated that there is no rockfall on this Project. Mr. Sjostrand stated yes, however he always thought that the C-34 was jet grouting and subsurface work. He thought that soil nails were under the C-68RL classification because the C-34 description does not include soil nails.

Mr. Rousseau stated that applying shotcrete over wire mesh is the same principle. The soil nail supports the soil and is the most important thing on the project rather than the shotcrete. He went on to say that without the anchor the shotcrete will not last and everything would slide down. The cliff is very steep, and they shoot the shotcrete onto the hillside from the road.

Executive Officer Ito asked if the soil nails provide the soil stabilization or are the soil nails installed to hold the shotcrete. Mr. Sjostrand stated that when you have cliff, there is a parabolic plane that slides and so the soil nails penetrates further than where the parabolic plane would form, and the soil nails would keep the mountain there. The shotcrete with the mesh ties it all together, but it's definitely the soil nails that hold up the side of the mountain. Mr. Leong asked how often they apply the shotcrete or gunite in his rock scaling operations. Mr. Rousseau stated that for the past couple of years and almost every project for DOT and DNLR they use shotcrete for the soil nail systems. Mr. Leong asked if it was used for soil stabilization or rockfall mitigation. Mr. Rousseau stated for both soil stabilization and rockfall mitigation. Mr. Leong asked if you have a rock formation, why do you need shotcrete to hold it in place. Mr. Rousseau stated that the shotcrete holds the rocks in place and stabilizes the hillside. Mr. Leong asked what the thickness of the shotcrete is. Mr. Rousseau stated that he uses 4 inches and sometimes up to 6 feet to make a barrier retaining wall.

Mr. Rousseau stated that for this project they used soil nails, wire fabric mesh, shotcrete and rebar on each side of the anchor. Mr. Higashihara asked if the

wire fabric mesh was used to hold the shotcrete and not as a netting to prevent rocks from falling. Mr. Rousseau stated yes.

Mr. Arita asked what is the difference between the gunite and shotcrete work. Mr. Rousseau stated that the gunite is a dry mix and the shotcrete is a wet mix. The wet mix is heavier on the hose. The wet mix comes in the big concrete truck and is applied by a compressor. The gunite is also applied with a compressor and the gunite is mixed with water at the end of the nozzle. If it starts raining you won't lose the gunite running down the hill. Gunite is used in swimming pools and concrete structures. Mr. Rousseau stated that he does not have a gunite contractor's license, but he has all the equipment and has been performing incidental and supplemental gunite work.

Mr. Takamatsu stated that there two prior Board determinations as to what a C-68RL contractor can do. He read the Board's August 22, 2008 meeting minutes as follows: "It was the consensus of the Board that shotcrete work may be performed by the C-68RL contractor as long as it is in conjunction with rockfall mitigation, and that soil stabilization is allowed under rockfall mitigation." He went on to read the Board's February 22, 2013 meeting minutes as follows: "The C-68RL classification was established a while ago and since getting his [Hi-Tech Rockfall] license, he has run into issues on whether the C-68RL can do certain types of work as it moves up the slope. The Board had previously said the C-68RL could do shotcrete work." Mr. Takamatsu went on to say that it appears that Mr. Sjostrand and the estimating section of Goodfellow would rely upon what's been provided in the written record and come to the conclusion that as long as the shotcrete work was in conjunction with rockfall mitigation work, a C-68RL contractor is allowed to do that work. He stated that it appears that both Messrs. Rousseau and Sjostrand did their job and felt that with respect to the Project they did have the proper license and they handled things in the proper manner.

Chairperson Isemoto asked if there is any type of rockfall mitigation that involves wire netting on this Project. Mr. Sjostrand stated there is no netting on this Project.

Executive  
Session:

At 9:50 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Leong, seconded by Mr. Arita, and unanimously carried, to enter into executive session to consult with Christopher Leong, Deputy Attorney General, on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(4).

At 10:30 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Higashihara, seconded by Mr. Arita, and unanimously carried, to move out of executive session and to reconvene to the Board's regular order of business.

Chairperson Isemoto made the following scope recommendations:

- (i) Is Rousseau Services permitted to perform rockfall mitigation work, including the installation of soil nails in conjunction with shotcrete, under its C-68 RL Rockfall mitigation contractor's license?

Recommendation: No, this project involves shotcrete work and does not include any type of rockfall mitigation that involves wire netting.

- (ii) Is slope stabilization work treated the same as rockfall mitigation work?

Recommendation: Due to the broad nature of this question the Board will not give a determination at this time.

Mr. Rousseau stated that the bid required the C-68RL contractor's license. Mr. Isemoto stated that the Board does not have control over the licenses that the agencies require on the proposal; the Board makes determinations on the scope of work of contractor classifications.

Mr. Rousseau asked what work the C-68RL contractor can and cannot perform? Chairperson Isemoto stated that the Board cannot provide a description of the C-68RL at this time because it has a draft of the C-68RL description its proposed rule amendments, and it would be considered as rule making if the Board provided a description of the C-68RL classification at this time. The Board has prior determinations on the work that a C-68RL contractor may perform. Executive Officer Ito asked DAG Leong if the Board could say, based upon its prior determinations, that the C-68RL may perform rockfall mitigation using rockfall protection systems such as wire netting. DAG Leong stated yes, the Board may use its prior determinations with regard to the work that may be performed by the C-68RL contractor.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Leong, seconded by Mr. Higashihara, and unanimously carried to approve the above scope recommendations.

Correspondence: Prometheus Construction

Requests that the Contractor's License Board clearly define the scope of the C-68RL Rockfall mitigation classification.

DAG Leong stated that the Board must refrain from creating a description of the C-68RL classification at a Board meeting because the Board has a proposed description in its current proposed administrative rules, and the establishment of classification descriptions must be addressed in the administrative rule process.

It was moved by Mr. Higashihara, seconded by Mr. Leong, and unanimously carried to discuss creating a description for the C-68RL classification at a later time as part of its administrative rule amendment process.

Chapter 91, HRS,  
Adjudicatory  
Matters:

Chairperson Isemoto called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 10:45 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

1. Settlement Agreements

- a. In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Pacific Elite Construction LLC and Emily W.M.W. Cheung; CLB 2020-411-L

In or about November 2019, Pacific Elite Construction LLC and Emily W.M.W. Cheung ("Respondents") entered a construction contract to renovate a home, but did not provide the homeowner with required disclosures regarding lien or bonding rights, or Respondents' right as contractors to resolve any alleged construction defects prior to the commencement of litigation in accordance with HRS section 672E-11, or the date work was to commence and number of days for completion.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violations of the following statute and rules: HRS section 444-25.5 (requiring disclosures of lien and bonding rights, and the contractor's right to resolve alleged construction defects prior to the commencement of any litigation in accordance with HRS 672E-11); HAR 16-77-79 (requiring pre-contract disclosures to homeowners, including disclosures of lien and bonding rights); and/or HAR 16-77-80 (requiring disclosures in written contracts with homeowners, including disclosure of the date work is to commence and the number of days for completion).

DAG Leong noted that the Respondents represent that they were previously unaware of the disclosure requirements for homeowners, and that they will make all disclosures required under Hawaii law and the Board's rules and regulations when contracting with homeowners in the future.

Respondents agrees to pay an administrative fine in the amount of \$2,500.00.

- b. Cy & Serena Construction Inc. and Solomon Phillip also known as Cy Phillip; CLB 2019-431-L

RICO received a complaint alleging that Cy & Serena Construction Inc. and Solomon Phillip also known as Cy Phillip ("Respondents") abandoned the construction of a retaining wall at a residence (the "Project").

RICO alleges that Respondents obtained a building permit for the Project although an unlicensed contractor contracted with the homeowner to perform the work on the Project.

Respondents allege that they did not receive any money for use of Cy & Serena Construction Inc.'s contractor's license number and only obtained the building permit to help the elderly homeowner.

Respondents further allege that they supervised and performed the construction of the footing of the wall for the Project without receiving any payment for the work and materials.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violations of the following statute and rules: HRS section 444-9.3 (aiding and abetting) and HAR 16-77-71 and 16-77-75 (RME responsible for acts and omission of

contracting entity).

Respondents agrees to pay an administrative fine in the amount of \$1,000.00.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Arita, seconded by Mr. Teves, and unanimously carried, to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action in the above cases.

- c. In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Brilliant Construction Inc. and Benny Lee; CLB 2018-284-L

On or about November 20, 2020, the Contractors License Boards ("the Board") issued its Final Order in this case and ordered Brilliant Construction Inc. and its responsible managing employee, Benny Lee ("Respondents") fully satisfy the fine imposed by the City and County of Honolulu in 2017/NOO-253 within six months of the entry of the Board's Final Order in this matter.

The Board's final order was efiled on or about December 12, 2020.

To date, Respondents have provided RICO with no documentation of having satisfied the aforementioned fine upon being requested to do so by RICO.

RICO requests that the Board revoke the contractors licenses of Respondents for their failure to comply with the requirements of the Board's November 20, 2020 Final Order.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Arita, seconded by Mr. Teves, and unanimously carried, to allow Mr. Lee an opportunity to appear before the Board.

Following the Board's review, deliberation and decisions in these matters, pursuant to HRS chapter 91, Chairperson Isemoto announced that the Board was reconvening to its open meeting at 11:17 a.m.
